

BOATMASTER

(i) Assessment

The assessment for Boatmaster is both written (1.5 hours) and separate oral (up to 40 mins). The separate, one-on-one oral assessment will be organised with an assessor. Instructions on this will be provided during the course. For Home Study students both the written and the oral will need to be completed with a local assessor. Instructions on how to book the assessment are included in the course notes provided.
