Powerboating Level 2

Aim: To achieve all basic Powerboat handling and seamanship skills.

Intermediate Powerboating

Aim: To complete open water and coastal passage by day.

Duration: 2 Days.

Qualification: Course Completion Certificate.

Prerequisites: Skills to Powerboating Level 2 (Marine VHF Radio Operator's Certificate Recommended).

- Bearings & Distance
- Charted Depths, Latitude & Longitude
- GPS & Chart Navigation
- Practical Pilotage & Passage-Making Afloat
- Open Water Boat Handling

Advanced Powerboating

Aim: To enable competent, high speed navigation by day or night.

Duration: 2 Days.

Qualification: Course Completion Certificate.

Prerequisites: Skills to Intermediate Powerboating level, Marine VHF Radio Operator's Certificate and First Aid.
